WEATHER ADVISORIES

If EVSC (Evansville-Vanderburgh School Corporation) is closed or delayed due to inclement weather, Bethel will follow their schedule. If school is closed or gets out early, church activities that day will be cancelled. If school has a delayed start, Bethel will delay the start of the day by the same amount of time.

What shall we bring? As of Tuesday, November 20, we have received 65 faith-promises (aka pledges, that can be adjusted as your situation changes) totaling \$175,647. We need twice that many for twice that much in order to make 2019 happen as we believe God would have it.



At the same time, we know we all have different resources. The point is that we all have resources. So, our goal is to have a faith-promise from each member. The amount is up to you! Let's break 100!

Tips for Year-End Giving

Year-end gifts. Gifts are deductible in the year made. Checks should be written and mailed (postmarked) or hand delivered by the last day of the year. Gifts charged to a credit card before the end of the year count for that year, even if the credit card bill isn't paid until the following year.

Tax savings from itemizing deductions. Only taxpayers who itemize their deductions on Form 1040 Schedule A can claim deductions for charitable contributions. This deduction is not available to individuals who choose the standard deduction. A taxpayer will have a tax savings only if the total itemized deductions (mortgage interest, charitable contributions, state and local taxes, etc.) exceed the standard deduction.

Tax savings from making a direct gift from an IRA account. People who are age 70 1/2 or older can contribute from their IRA directly to a charity and avoid paying income taxes on the distribution. This is known as a qualified charitable distribution. Since the taxpayer is not taxed on this distribution, they will have a tax savings even if they do not itemize deductions. Please consult with your tax and/or investment advisor for more information.

Electronic Giving

Bethel United Church of Christ has implemented the UCC e-giving program administered through Vanco Services, LLC. Following is a question and answer summary of the program:

Q: *What is UCCe-giving?*

A: *UCCe-giving* is the automated giving program of the United Church of Christ designed to make it easy for givers to give.

Q: *How is it automatic?*

A: Once you authorize the transfer on the e-giving website or the mobile app, your specified contribution is electronically transferred directly from your checking or savings account to your church's account. You may also give by credit or debit card. You may specify a gift as one-time or recurring weekly or monthly, and may make changes to recurring gifts at any time.

Q: *My church asks us for an annual pledge of financial support. Is this the same thing?*

A: You'll still make a pledge. Electronic giving just helps you fulfill it! Electronic giving may also be used by those who don't practice pledging, or wish to make an additional gift.

Q: *What are the advantages?*

A: It saves you time and effort and your church benefits from more stable contribution levels.

Q: *When will my contribution be deducted from my account?*

A: On the date(s) you specify on the e-giving website or in the mobile app.

Q: *If I do not write checks, how do I balance my checkbook?*

A: Since your contribution is made at a pre-established time, you simply record it in your check register on the appropriate date.

Q: *Without a cancelled check, how can I prove I made my contribution?*

A: Your bank statement gives you an itemized list of electronic transfers. It is your proof of contribution. Of course, your church will continue to provide a giving statement.

Q: *Is electronic funds transfer risky?*

A: Electronic contribution is less risky than a check contribution. It cannot be lost, stolen, or destroyed. It has an extremely high rate of accuracy.

Q: *What if I change banks or accounts?*

A: Just enter the changes on the e-giving website or in the mobile app.

Q: *How much does this cost?*

A: It costs you nothing and it saves you time.

Q: *What if I try UCCE-giving and don't like it, or need to change it for any reason?*

A: You can cancel or change your authorization at any time on the e-giving website or in the mobile app.

Q: *How do I access the e-giving website?*

A: Just go to the church's website and click on "giving" in the top banner. This will take you to our Online Giving page. At the end of the introductory paragraph, there is a "Give Here" link.

Q: *How do I access the e-giving mobile app?*

A: The mobile app is "Give+". Just search for "Give+" or "Give Plus" in the app store on your mobile device.

Q: *How will I participate in the offering of gifts during worship?*

A: If you wish, you may enter the amount given followed by "e-gift" on the offering envelope. Even if you don't, your giving statement will include all gifts received via e-giving.

Q: *What if I need assistance using the website or app, or have additional questions?*

A: Call either Ruth Saalweachter or John Stevens in the office and they will be glad to assist you.

Q: *What is Vanco Services and how are they related to UCCe-giving®?*

A: Vanco Services, LLC is the financial technology company chosen by the United Church of Christ as a partner in offering **UCCe-giving®**. Vanco provides secure, inexpensive electronic giving services to more than 10,000 churches. Information entrusted to Vanco is kept strictly confidential and is never sold, rented or given away.

MISSIONS TEAM:



Our Christmas Offering will go to Sycamore Services. Its mission statement: Sycamore Services, Inc. makes a difference in the lives of individuals with disabilities and others experiencing daily challenges by providing individualized training and service to increase independence and enhance quality of life. It is a 501©3 nonprofit agency. The director of the Evansville branch is Michelle Kirk, one of our ASP sponsors and Carmen Mazick’s daughter. Kairos Prison Ministry - Kairos Prison Ministry International, Inc. (Kairos) is a lay-led, interdenominational Christian ministry in which men and women volunteers bring Christ’s love and forgiveness to prisoners and their families. The word, Kairos, is a Greek word meaning in “God’s Special Time” or in the “Fullness of Time,” indicating an opportunity for our participants and guests to reconsider their life choices. The mission of the Kairos Prison Ministry is to share the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to impact the hearts and lives of incarcerated men, women and youth, as well as their families, to become loving and productive citizens of their communities.

The United States is the world’s leader in incarceration with 2.3 million people currently in the nation’s prisons or jails — a 500% increase over the past thirty years. The prison environment is a dark place, where prisoners face violence, anger, gangs, and loneliness daily.

Kairos Prison Ministry volunteers step into this darkness to hold a 3 ½ day weekend, with many participants made up primarily of negative leaders within the prison. Through talks, discussions and Chapel meditations prisoners learn that they are worthy of God’s love, light, and grace. That ***no matter who they are or what they have done, God forgives them.***

Kairos operates in prisons in 37 U.S. states, and nine countries: Australia, Canada, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Nicaragua, Honduras, Peru, South Africa, and the United Kingdom. Kairos Prison Ministry International, Inc. is a 501(c) (3) not-for-profit corporation chartered in the State of Florida.

I recently participated in the Kairos 3 ½ day retreat inside the Rockville Women’s Prison located in Rockville, Indiana. My experience with the weekend was awesome and life-giving. The love of Christ was very present. It was wonderful to see two women become followers of Jesus and ask for forgiveness. Experiencing life changes were apparent during the whole weekend and it was very emotional to witness the movement of the Holy Spirit in the lives of the women incarcerated in the Rockville Women’s Prison. ~ *Joyce Johnson*

The faculty at Stockwell has grown to really appreciate any and all efforts Bethel has shown. They are very eager to have us there, to help in any way that we can. One of the teachers there said to me recently that she wished there were more of us to volunteer. Keeping this in mind, Sunday's message and music centered on "hope." I pray that each of us will make ourselves available to bring "hope" to those children at Stockwell . . . they really do need us! See Linda Hape, Barry Burleigh, or me if you are interested. 
